NOTE – DEPARTURE TIMECHANGE April 21 – Visit Washington, Missouri (2 sneakers) - All aboard for this Amtrak train trip from downtown St. Louis to Washington, MO. Once we arrive we visit the Iron Spike Model Train Museum. Lunch at Hawthorne Inn then onto the Washington Historical Society Museum Society to see and hear the history of Washington, MO. You will see the city's history from corn cob pipes to World Wars I and II items.
