Featuring Washington Island, lunch at Al Johnson's, a private cruise on Edelweiss II, Lambeau Field Tour and Farmer's Markets!

September 5 – 9, 2023

5 days, 4 night motorcoach trip

Tuesday, September 5— We're on Our Way!

This morning we depart from Waterloo and Columbia, IL to the Cape Cod of the Midwest. We'll take breaks along the way, with lunch on our own at one of our favorite stops, **Portillo's** a local chain famous for their hot dogs, burgers, ribs and sandwiches, made quick and served right. Once we cross into Wisconsin we will stop at one of the most fascinating museums about flight, the EAA, the museum of the **Experimental Aviation Association** located in Oshkosh, WI. Every year they have a famous fly-in for pilots from all over. We overnight tonight at the **Radisson Conference Center** in Green Bay, WI located next to the Oneida Casino. The hotel will provide a \$10 voucher for any restaurant on property to apply towards dinner and the casino will give you some fun money. **(B, \$10 Dinner Voucher)**

Wednesday, September 6 — Lambeau Field and arrive into Door County

Put out your luggage, enjoy a hot breakfast at the hotel then head over to one of the NFL's most beloved teams' home field, **Lambeau Field**. We enjoy a guided tour and learn all about the history of the Green Bay Packers, also known as cheese heads for the triangle shaped cheese hats they wear to the game. Enjoy a stop in the gift shop before we head up the peninsula known as Door County.

Our dinner today is at **The Log Den**, in the heart of Door County. A wooded drive leads to the hand-carved masterpiece; a meticulously detailed 10,000 square foot restaurant and lounge was designed and built by the Lautenbach family, residents of Egg Harbor for five generations. With an atmosphere like no other, an eager to serve staff, and a savory menu, it is sure to be a one-of-a-kind Door County experience.

Our hotel is the **Open Hearth Lodge**, located on 6.5 acres of scenic Door County open space with landscaped lawn, rural meadows and young forests. Explore the property, catching a glimpse of deer, ducks or other wildlife with a walk beyond the patio. The owners and operators give guests a first-hand account of the ins-and-outs to enjoying Door County, while offering all the expected accommodations and amenities for a quiet night's stay. **(B, D)**



Thursday, September 7— Onward to Washington Island



This morning after breakfast, we head to the docks for our ferry ride to **Washington Island**! During the 30-minute boat ride, our local guide will explain the history of the outlying Islands with their lighthouses and give an introduction to Washington Island. This island at the tip of Door County is home to quaint lighthouses and an incredible Norwegian Church that is an exact replica of one in Norway. We will learn about life on an island as they meet some of the residents. We have lunch at a local favorite before a stop at "**Den Norske Grenda**" for pictures of the sod-roofed Norwegian Building. Next we head to historic **Washington Harbor** and beautiful **School House Beach**, where we shall have a "stone skipping contest." Step back into history at the farm museum and learn about island life without electricity! We enjoy a visit the **Fragrant Isle Lavender Farm**. We then return to the harbor before returning to Door County.

Dinner tonight is a Fish Boil at **Pelletiers** in Fish Creek. The Fish Boil is one of the iconic traditions of Door County, complete with a fiery "boil over." (If you prefer chicken instead of the white fish, let us know prior to the tour) **(B, L, D)**

Friday, September 8 — Farmers Market, a Lighthouse and Goats on the Roof!

This morning after breakfast we tour **Bjorklunden Chapel**, a small wooden, 12-century Norwegian stave, church style chapel. It has 41 fresco paintings and beautiful wood carvings. This chapel of peace, located on the Lake Michigan shore was built during WWII. It is a beautiful picture stop!

Next up is **Koepsel's Farm Market**, the oldest farmers market in Door County. Sample some of Wisconsin's famous cheddar cheese as well as dried cherries and chocolate covered dried cherries, homemade jams/jellies/relishes. With a selection of cheese, fruits, meat and craft beer, there's always something to find and bring home!

Our next stop before lunch is **Peninsula State Park & Eagle Bluff Lighthouse**. Perched on a bluff 76 feet above Green Bay's glistening waters, Eagle Bluff Lighthouse's lamp brought solace to many a sailor suffering through a storm's gale or the dark of night. Restored to its past glory, Eagle Bluff Lighthouse Museum is a tribute to the keepers who kept the lamp lit on many a dark and stormy night. During this tour knowledgeable docents will share the personal stories of the keepers who manned the light from 1868 — 1926. Furnished with some of the keepers' original furnishings, as well as authentic period antiques, the museum is a story of not only the men who toiled through the night, but also their wives and children.



We stop for lunch at the world famous **Al Johnson's Restaurant** for a Swedish Variety lunch. For years visitors would stop for photos of the goats on the roof, and would keep returning for the great food! They have become so popular that the goats have their own web cam.

And we'll be sure to stop at a cheese shop for that authentic Wisconsin experience on our way to the brand new **Cambria Hotel** in Milwaukee. You will be treated like a VIP on our private cruise with dinner aboard the **Edelweiss II**. Watch the sunset as we enjoy a two-hour cruise along the Milwaukee River and the Inner Harbor of Lake Michigan. **(B, L, D)**

Saturday, September 9 — Homeward Bound

Today we bid a fond farewell to Wisconsin as we return to Missouri. We'll make plenty of stops along the way! Thank you for traveling with us! **(B)**

Travel Protection:

Methods of Payment:

We accept cash, check or debit from a First National Bank of Waterloo account. We do not accept credit or debit cards at this time.

Cancellations:

Our cancellation fees vary according to the type of tour. Your deposit is refundable up to the final payment due date unless previously noted. If you need to cancel for a covered reason after final payment, you may file a claim with proper documentation to request refund.

Tour Inclusions:

Classic 55 Club tour cost includes all attractions, lodging, motor coach transportation, meals as noted and gratuities for all included for any events or services that are provided. If the trip includes airfare the cost of the ticket is included unless otherwise noted. Some airlines charge for checked baggage, which is not included in the tour price unless noted.

Motor Coach Pick Up Locations:

All pick up points allow parking for your vehicle. Please park in the specified area of the parking lot as to not disrupt usual business. Neither First National Bank of Waterloo nor the parking lot owners assume responsibility for incidents occurring to parked cars. The motor coach usually originates from the Waterloo VFW, 406 Veteran's Drive. Please park on the very west side of the VFW parking lot, making sure not to block the dumpster. Columbia pick up is at the Schnuck's Marketplace, 1000 Columbia Center, park towards the road, near the Post Office. The motor coach will pull up to the sidewalk of the post office. Please bring your luggage to the motor coach to be loaded.

Seating on the motor coach:

At this time, seating is assigned. We are currently trying to keep motorcoach to less than capacity. Special seating requests are honored on the basis of medical need and availability.

Single Travelers requesting roommates:

If you would like to travel with The Classic 55 Club, but do not have a roommate for a specific trip, let the coordinator know when you complete the reservation process and they can provide you with the names of other travelers of the same sex who are also looking for a roommate. If there is mutual agreement to room together, you will be charged the double rate. Of course, if you prefer to travel individually, you can still register for single occupancy.
